






## HOW TO USE STUDY STACK

### STEP BY STEP INSTRUCTIONS

Example Image	Step
	<p>Login and Open an Internet Browser.</p> <p>Go to <a href="http://www.studystack.com">http://www.studystack.com</a></p>
	<p>Go to the upper right hand of the Home page and login or create a new account.</p> <p>Once you create an account, login with your username and password.</p>
	<p>Once you are logged in, you will see your account information and can begin creating your stack.</p> <p>Select <b>Create new stack</b>.</p>

	<p>Create a <b>name</b> for your stack.</p> <p>Provide a <b>description</b>.</p> <p>Choose a <b>category</b> from the drop down window.</p> <p>Check the box next to “Prevent other users from modifying data” to prevent changes to your stack.</p> <p>Check the last box to have Study Stack generate random fill-in-the-blank clues for activities.</p> <p>Save Changes.</p>
	<p>Next choose the <b>Data</b> tab.</p> <p>You can begin to enter your data directly into Study Stack.</p> <p>Enter your question and answer in the columns.</p> <p><b>OR</b> you can import an existing list. (See the next frame)</p>

 <p>An alternative way of adding cards is to import a block of text. By default, each line of text should be for one card. The parts of that card (i.e. question and answer) must be separated by a delimiter, such as a comma or equal sign. Whatever you use as the delimiter should not appear anywhere else in the data. You may use any editor you like to create this text. When you are ready to import the text, copy and paste it into the space below. Then specify what the delimiter characters are and click on the Import button. The text you entered will be parsed and added to the blanks above. (Additional rows will be added if necessary.) After your data is imported, review the table above to make sure that your data is being parsed properly, and then click on the "Save Changes" button to have your data copied to the StudyStack server.</p> <p>Delimiter: #    Card Delimiter: end of line</p> <p>Import</p>	<p>You can create a list of questions and answers.</p> <p>Each line of text should be for one card. The parts of that card (i.e. question and answer) must be separated by a <b>delimiter</b>, such as a comma or equal sign. Whatever you use as the delimiter should not appear anywhere else in the data.</p> <p><b>Copy and paste</b> the list in. Specify what the delimiter is and click <b>Import</b>.</p>
 <p>Add one or more images (.png, .jpg, .gif) to the table below. After dragging and resizing the image as desired, add labels and drag and resize them. Each label can also have a line connecting it to a specific spot on the image. To add a line, click the label and then drag the small diamond which is below the label. You can also add multiple labels by clicking "New Label".</p> <p>Image file: <input type="text"/> <input type="button" value="Browse..."/> <input type="text" value="Label"/> <input type="button" value="Add Label"/></p> <p>Background color: <input type="text" value="CCCCCC"/>    Label background: <input type="text" value="FFFF00"/>    Label text color: <input type="text" value="000000"/>    Label Font Size: <input type="text" value="14pt"/></p>	<p>Next, create a slide for the <b>Targets</b>.</p> <p>This is optional so you can skip this if you do not want to use this feature.</p> <p><b>Browse</b> for your image.</p> <p>Once you find it. Select <b>Add Image</b>.</p> <p>You can resize image and add additional images as needed.</p>




Next, add labels to your image.

This will create quizzes to identify the parts of your image.

Type in the label and add label. The label can be resized and placed on the image. The background color and font size can be changed. This will become a target.

Save changes.




You are finished!

Now you can browse your Study Stack and share it with your class!



To return to your account and see your stacks, go to the upper right hand of any page and click on My StudyStacks. This will take you to a list of your stacks which you can edit, delete or create new stacks.



To share with your students, just copy the URL for the study stack and give it to your students.

They can start exploring right away!
